





Three Questions About the Silence of God


2. Am I more concerned about how God is presenting himself to me or am I more concerned about how I am presenting myself to God?

11-12:

"He has kindled his wrath against me and counts me as his adversary. His troops come on together; they have cast up their siege ramp against me and encamp around my tent."

Job's Poetic Image

Do you get the irony? The image is of God amassing a huge force, troops building siege ramp which were used against large fortified cities! But in this case, all of that muscle and might, quite ridiculously is directed at just one little hapless tent.

Job's Complaint

God's Power
Overwhelms

me!

What we might say:

When I especially need God's comforting presence, He overwhelms me with Disproportionate Power.
